### **LAT Peer Review**

The Learning Academies Trust has been involved in the Peer Review cycle for many years and benefits from an experienced set of leaders who have grown the process in the Trust over time.

The Trust is able to provide both Lead Reviewer and Improvement Champion Training to develop the skillset of identified individuals. The power of the Peer Review cycle, lies in the ability of our schools to identify and deploy excellent practitioners who can take a lead and support the review cycle with their expert enquiry skills.

#### **Lead Peer Reviewer Training**

The Lead reviewer will be a senior leader in school, Headteacher, Deputy or Head of School and will work as part of team. They will have excellent enquiry skills and have an ability to ask

The training will outline the peer review process and the role of the lead reviewer. It will support the reviewers to develop precise questioning along with supporting the development of their leadership skills.

#### **Improvement Champion Training**

These practitioners are involved in school or Trust improvement work and want to develop their skills to become experts in facilitating improvement workshops and learn more about evidence-based improvement strategies and research.

The training will outline the peer review process along with the role of the IC and their potential during the peer review process. It will also focus on a range of analysis and decision-making tools along with the consideration of the sources of research.

# Initial Teacher Training (ITT) and Early Career Framework (ECF)



### **School Based ITT Training**

At Learning Academies Trust, we are committed to recruiting and training the next generation of school practitioners.

Primary School Direct is a one-year, full time, school-based route into teaching. With this training route our students are based in a Plymouth primary school and will also be taught by our university partner. Plymouth Marjon University have extensive experience of training teachers and have recently been graded as 'Good' at Ofsted.

Students are based in a school from day one experiencing hands-on learning. Some training will be school-based, led by our network of subject leaders of educations (SLEs) who are on hand to provide evidence informed, school-based subject and pedagogy input and support. This will be supported with additional pedagogical input form Marjon.

Successful completion of PTSA's School Direct course leads to Qualified Teacher Status (QTS) and a PGCE qualification, with up to 60 Masters credits after one academic (September – July) year.
